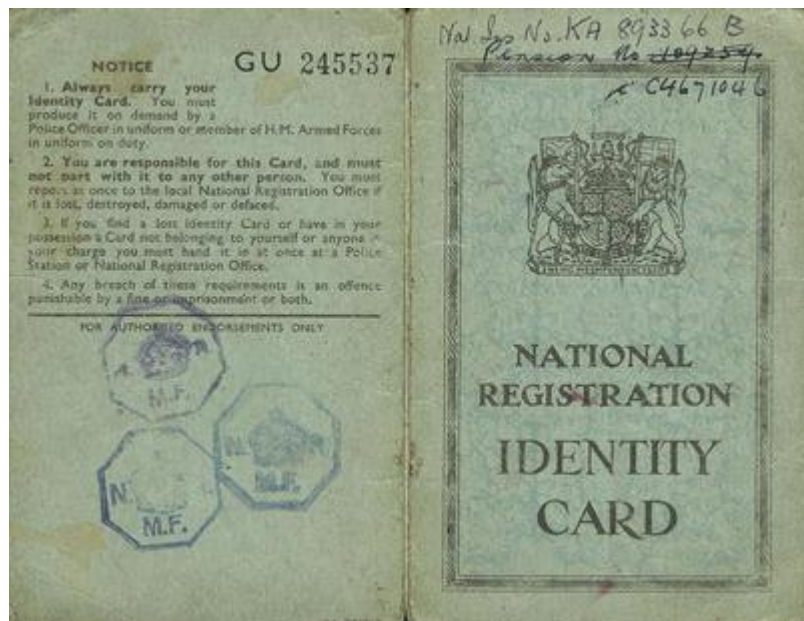

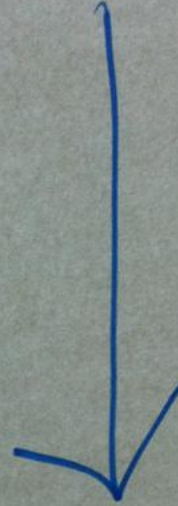

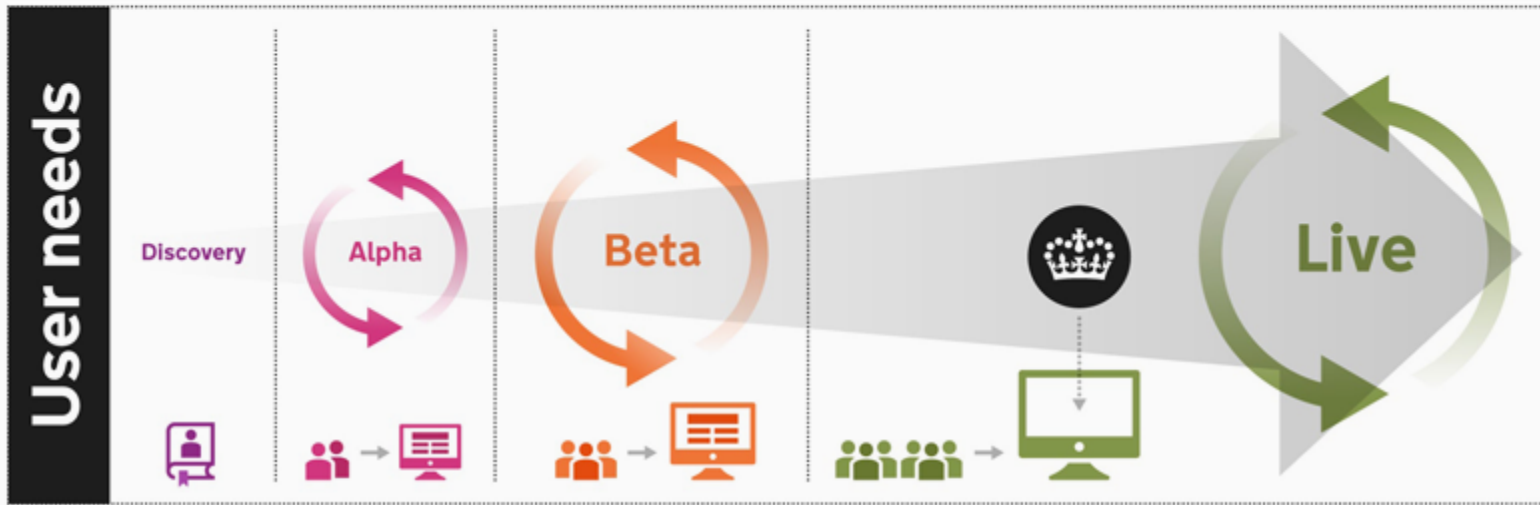

OIX Contributor Agreement

Open Identity Exchange ("OIX") organizes and supports programs, initiatives, development workshops, information services and working groups of various types (collectively "Working Groups") each of which may result in one or more draft and final versions of different types of output, report, white paper, Trust Framework industry recommendation, OIX process recommendation or other deliverable (the "OIX Deliverables"). Working Groups may be open to both OIX Members and persons (acting in their individual or representative capacity) that are not OIX Members ("Contributors"). All Working Group Contributors are subject to the charter, operating rules and other requirements applicable to that Working Group as established by OIX from time to time. Contributions by OIX Members in Working Groups are subject to the OIX Member Rules. This Agreement applies to Contributions by Contributors.

OIX welcomes input, suggestions and other feedback in written or oral form ("Contributions") regarding the OIX Deliverables.
